SAN ANTONIO TRIVIA — DID YOU KNOW?

- The famous arched portion of the Alamo was actually added in 1850 by the US Army when they used the Alamo chapel as a commissary depot.
- The first wave of enlistees trained at what would soon become Lackland AFB in November 1942. Lackland would soon become the premier training location for all Air Force enlisted personnel.
- Brooks AFB was named for a native of San Antonio, Sidney J. Brooks. Brooks was among the first Aviation Cadets to train at Kelly Field in 1917 after the US entered into WWI. Cadet Brooks completed ground school with the highest honors in the first class to graduate. From there, he transferred to Kelly Field for flight training, and was killed on Nov 13, 1917 when his Curtiss JN-4 crashed as he attempted to land at Kelly Field.
